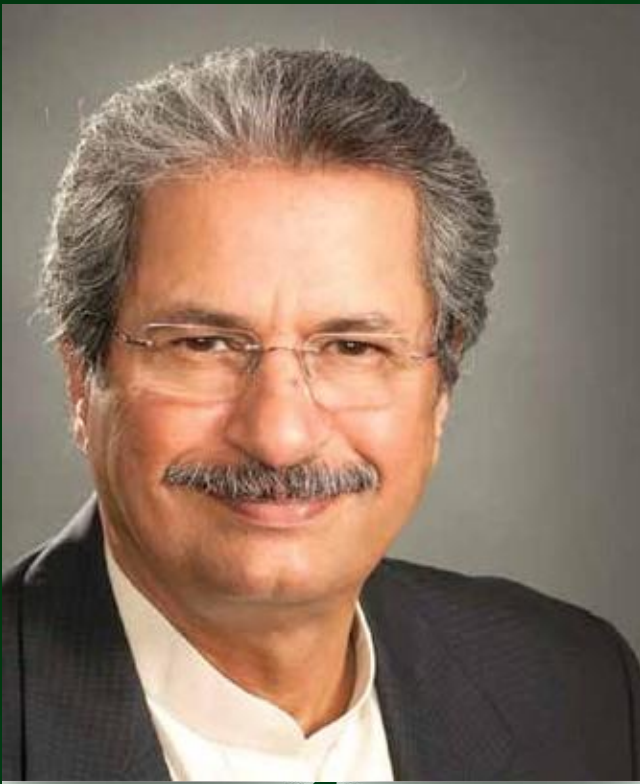

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INTRODUCTION OF IBCC

The Inter Board Committee of Chairmen (IBCC) was established at Federal level through a resolution passed initially in 1972 which was revamped in 1987 with ornament to play more vital role among Boards of Intermediate and Secondary Education (BISEs) of the country, particularly to bring reforms, uniformity in examination and assessment system.

To bring perfection in examination and assessment system of all the authorized examining bodies upto Higher Secondary level ensuring uniformity and accuracy in the system through coordination among all members of IBCC.

OBJECTIVES/ FUNCTIONS OF IBCC

- To exchange information among the Member Boards on all aspects of Intermediate and Secondary Education;
- To achieve a fair measure of uniformity of academic evaluation and curricular standards;
- To promote curricular and extra-curricular activities on Inter Board basis;
- To serve as a forum of discussion and consultation for the chief executives of the Boards on all matters relating to the development and promotion of Intermediate and Secondary Education, and to make suitable recommendations to the Government;
- To authenticate educational documents issued by the recognized examining bodies and settle equivalence of foreign qualifications up-to Higher Secondary level.

KEY ACHIEVEMENTS



1. E-PORTAL AND SMART PHONE APP FOR EQUIVALENCE

In line with the vision of Prime Minister of Pakistan “The Digital Pakistan”, and under the directives of Federal Minister for Education & Professional Training, the Inter Board Committee of Chairmen (IBCC) decided to digitalize its services under the leading role of Secretary IBCC.

In this context, the Smart Phone App and E-Portal for Equivalence were launched by the Honorable Minister for Federal Education and Professional Training, Mr. Shafqat Mahmood. Speaking on the occasion the Minister said that IBCC is on a right track to integrate technology in delivery of services and to facilitate Equivalence process.

The Smart Phone App was developed in a way to assist applicants and with essential features of this modern era. The App minimized the problems of the public and increased the accessibility. By using Mobile App and IBCC E-Portal for Equivalence the applicants can apply online and deposit their fee from the App.

Another feature of courier service was also integrated; the realtime tracking of equivalence application is available to applicants. Applicants are notified and they can track their application by using IBCC App and E-portal. The Smart Phone App is available on Google Play Store and IOS/App Store.



2. INITIATING IBCC DIGITAL VERIFICATION OF EQUIVALENCE CERTIFICATES

The Honorable Minister for Federal Education and Professional Training, Mr Shafqat Mahmood, launched Digital Equivalence Certificate Verification Service introduced by Inter Board Committee of Chairmen (IBCC).

This service has enhanced the accessibility, reduced the cost & time and other hurdles faced by organizations within or outside country.

The IBCC integrated security feature in certificate through Encrypted QR Code. The organizations, institutions or universities do not need to send documents to IBCC for verification, as the verification is now just a click away by scanning QR code from anywhere around the world. This is a real-time verification enabling organizations to quickly verify data on their mobile or computer and will receive a verification email for their official record.



3. ISO 9001:2015 CERTIFICATION

Under the leading role of Secretary IBCC, the IBCC has been brought to the international standards and has been awarded ISO 9001:2015 certification which is a globally recognized quality management standard developed and published by the International Organization for Standardization (ISO). After the certification from ISO, the standards of IBCC are now internationally recognized.



4. ONLINE PORTAL FOR ATTESTATION

IBCC introduced Online Portal for attestation. The portal is more flexible, time saving and need less efforts. The applicants can apply for attestation of their documents and book appointment through Online Portal. Customized requirements are generated for applicants/users and online challan form is also generated. The portal is functioning in transparent way enabling applicants to trace their applications as well.

5. LAUNCH OF E-OFFICE

To expedite office affairs, the Inter Board Committee of Chairmen (IBCC) introduced E-Office at its secretariat and its regional offices. The launching ceremony of E-Office was held at IBCC Secretariat and Ms Wajiha Qamar, Parliamentary Secretary for Federal Education & Professional Training, graced the ceremony as chief guest.

Dr Mallah briefed the Parliamentary Secretary about an urgent need to adopt e-filing and office automation system, as it is cost effective, has digital backup, automatic data retention, easy access to data and decreasing the carbon footprint.

Addressing the occasion, Ms Wajiha Qamar reiterated that IBCC had been following the directives of Prime Minister by introducing transparency, facilitation & ease of service by use of technology. The adoption of digital system would eliminate outdated office system and the new system would track the file which would lead to timely implementation of government policies.

Executive Director NITB, Director General PMO NITB, Project Director (E-Office) NITB and other officials graced the launching ceremony with their presence.



6. SERVICE-ORIENTED WEBSITE

The IBCC website was revamped & made service-oriented to make it easy & accessible. The website is designed to cover all the main features of the contemporary epoch keeping in view the vision of Federal Minister for FE&PT for better public service delivery and reforms to facilitate public at large in more efficient manner.



7. COMPLAINT REDRESSAL MECHANISM

A new complaint redressal mechanism has been devised to address the issues of the public at the earliest. The IBCC is addressing the complaints of general public through the following means;

i. Universal Access Number (UAN)

Universal Access Number (UAN) was installed as single point of contact for general public throughout the country for all kind of details/informations related to IBCC. Before that, people were facing problems as there were only two operational numbers and large number of applicants seeking information, due to this, the lines were busy most of the time. Now people can call on UAN and connect to the relevant officer or section without any delay.



ii. Live Messenger Chat

Live messenger chat service for live question answer has also been launched. IBCC designated a team to reply all the queries relevant to attestation, equivalence and other matters related to IBCC in office hours. Hundreds of people contact through Live Messenger Chat for seeking information and their application status which are addressed accordingly.



iii. Social Media

The Inter Board Committee of Chairmen (IBCC) also enhanced their Social Media cell as per the need of modern era. The IBCC is addressing people and making announcements through their social media accounts. The followers of Facebook increased from 250 to 25,000 plus and approx. 500,000+ post engagements have been recorded so far. The official twitter account of IBCC is also created and the important information is shared on it. The IBCC is also updating information and guidelines for students through their official Youtube Channel.



iv. Complaints Email IDs

New Email IDs have been generated to address the issues of applicants in more appropriate way. A dedicated team of IBCC is addressing the issues of general public through email and so far complaints of more than 2000 applicants were addressed through email.

v. Complaint Box

A complaint box has been installed at IBCC's head office and all regional offices to address the issues of general public and to assure the smooth functioning of organization. The complaints, if any, are checked by the Secretary IBCC and in-charge of regional offices.

vi. E-Kachehri

The Secretary IBCC is conducting the E-Kachehri on bi-monthly basis to address the unattended complaints & queries. The Secretary briefs about the new policies & initiatives taken by IBCC. During the Kachehri, Director Equivalence, Director Meetings, Director IT and Social Media Team accompany the Secretary IBCC to address all the issues in real-time. So far, IBCC has conducted 17 E-Kachehries and more than 200,000 people joined the live kachehries and watched the recorded videos on IBCC's official Website, Facebook page and Youtube Channel.



8. ESTABLISHMENT OF IT SECTION

A new full-fledged IT section was established at IBCC Secretariat which is the dire need of the modern era. Also, various IT initiatives have been taken, under which, National IT Board has been requested to support IBCC to achieve this goal and they show their keen interest and utmost support in automation of all internal processes.



9. MoU b/w IBCC & LEARNING PITCH

The Secretary IBCC Dr Ghulam Ali Mallah and CEO Learning Pitch Syed Wajahat signed MoU and launched a free online assessment platform to aid students during COVID-19 pandemic. The platform includes more than 100,000 conceptual questions encompassing all the educational boards across Pakistan, hence enabling students to prepare for their board exams in a safe and healthy environment. The platform can be accessed through ibcc.myinteracademy.com



10. EXTEND FEE DEPOSIT FACILITY TO ALL BRANCHES OF NBP

The facility to deposit IBCC fee through National Bank of Pakistan (NBP) was limited to 280 branches due to which people were facing problems. To facilitate general public, IBCC had an agreement with NBP and as a result branches were increased from 280 to 1400 across Pakistan. Now the facility of IBCC's fee submission for attestation, equivalence and verification of documents is available on all branches of NBP.



11. ONE-WINDOW FACILITY

The facility of fee submission through TCS (1-Link) has been extended to candidates to submit documents and fee at the same place as one-window facility. Applicants do not need to visit bank for fee submission, if visiting TCS.



12. AGREEMENT WITH TCS TO COLLECT DOCUMENTS

The IBCC signed an agreement with TCS to facilitate students in submission of documents through all TCS branches across the country and to deliver the same at their doorsteps.

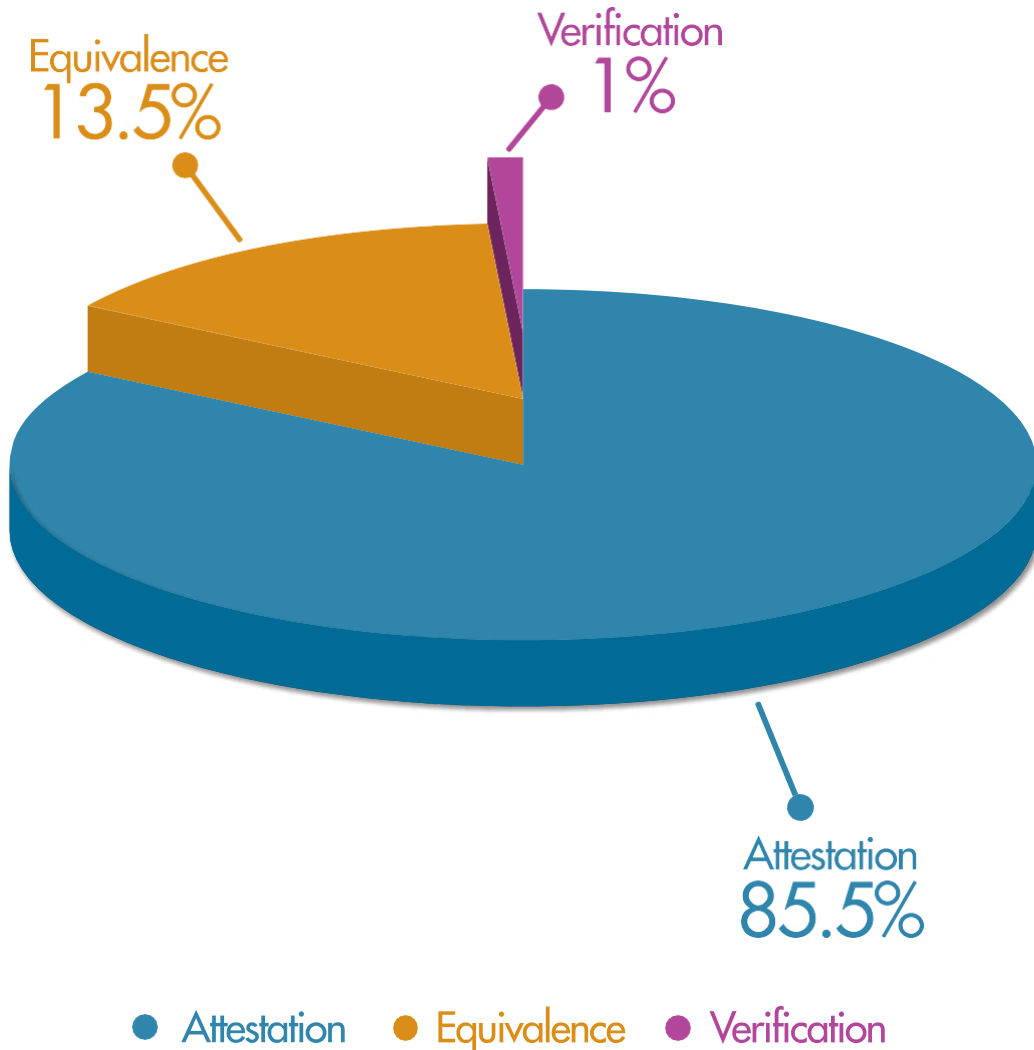

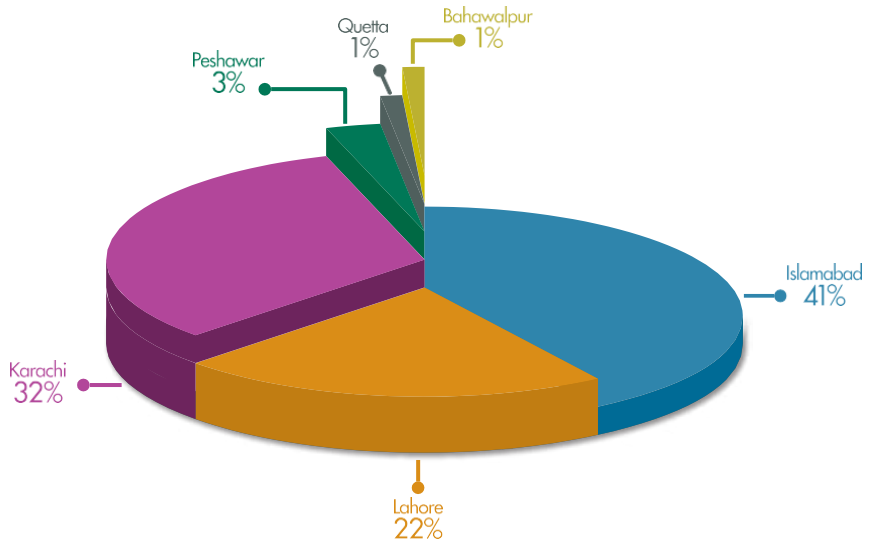

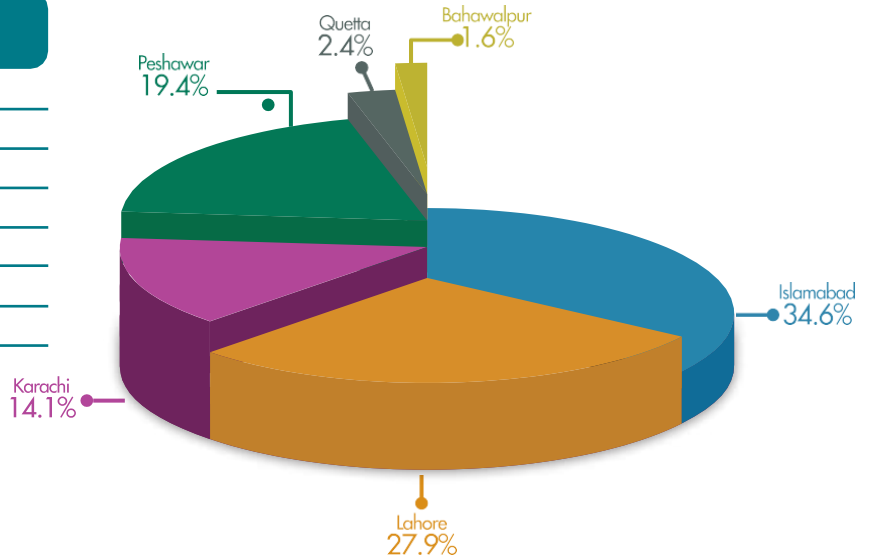

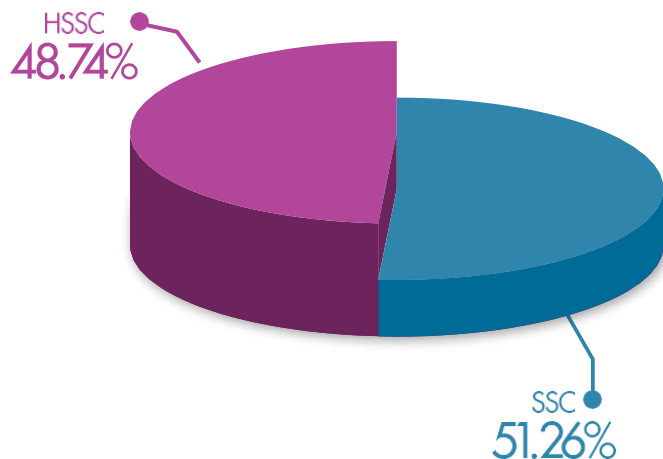

In Badminton category BISE Lahore won the title, while Federal Board Islamabad (FBISE) 2nd and BISE Abbottabad got 3rd position.

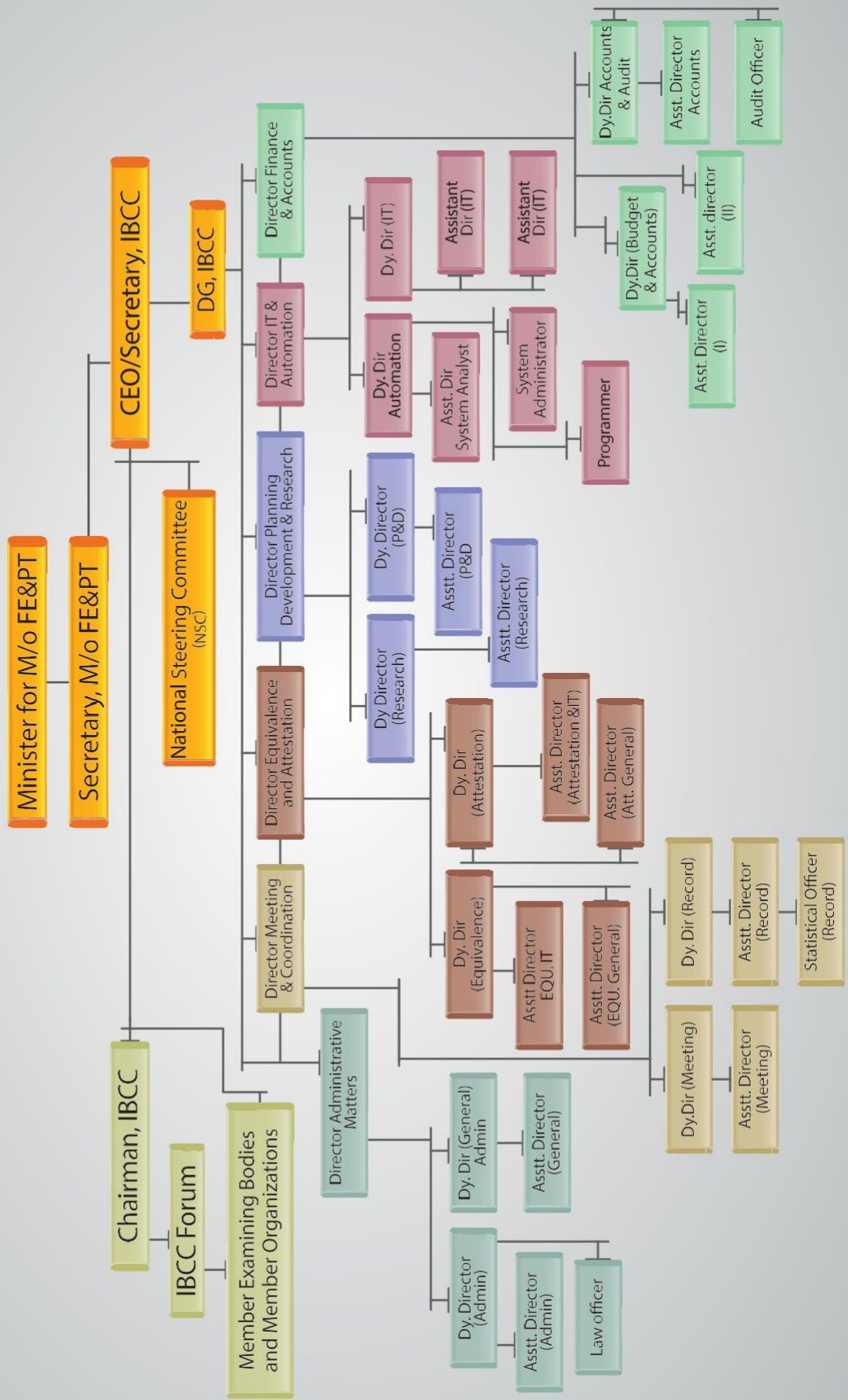

FUTURE PLANS

According to the IBCC Resolutions, all Examination Boards shall gradually adopt SLO Based Examination from 2022 onwards. Record of boards shall be computerized and made available to IBCC for online varification of applicant's certificates seeking attestation from IBCC for their studies, employment and any other purpose.

Online Equivalence: Equivalence portal of IBCC is already in working. So far 2000 Equivalence Certificates have been issued by processing online applications submitted by the candidates mostly having GCE 'O' and 'A' Level. In future, all cases of equivalence shall be gradually shifted to online submission by adopting IT based services thus improving the quality and to bring the services at par with International Standards.

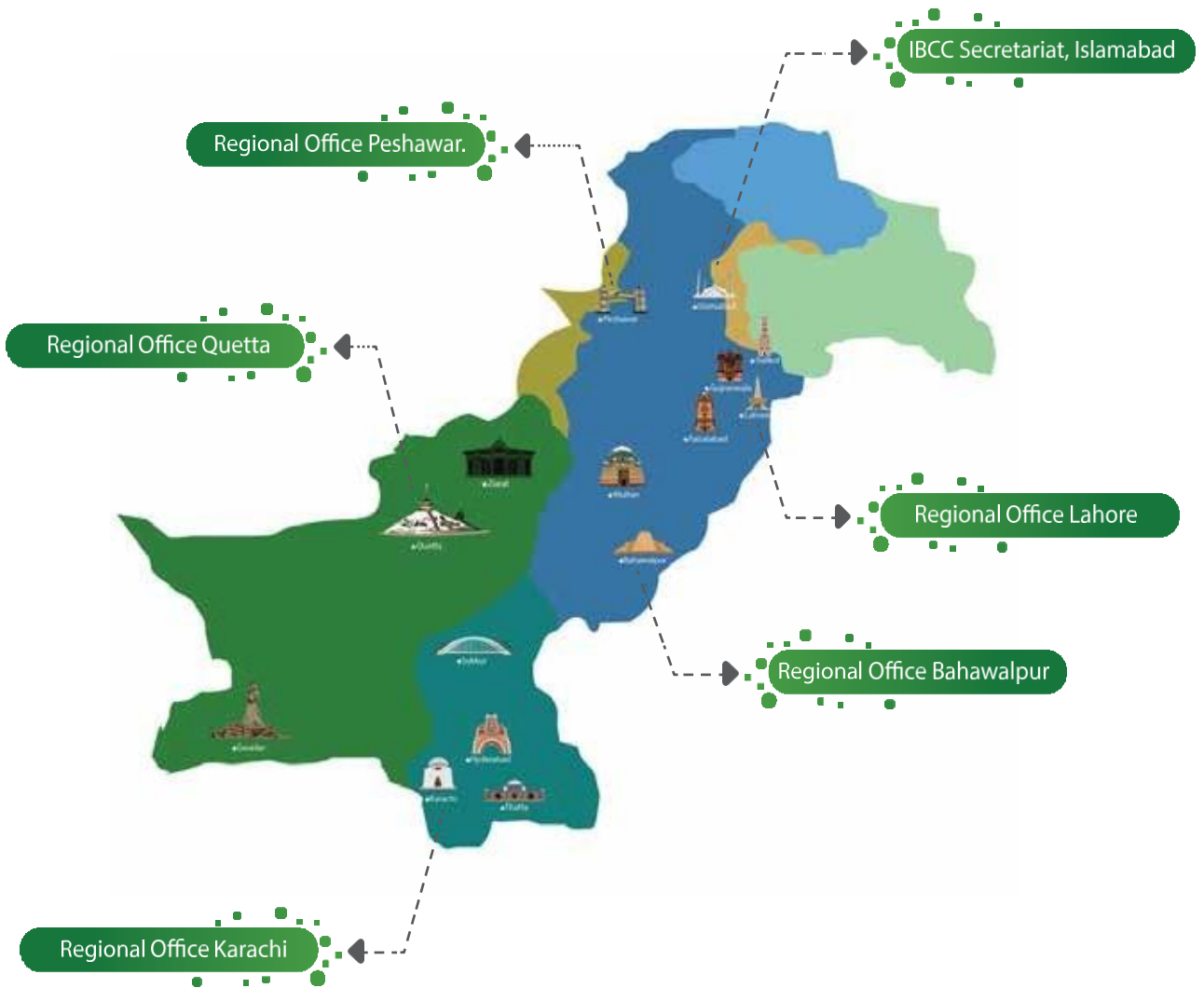
