179th Forum Meeting

The 179th IBCC meeting, hosted by BISE Peshawar in Skardu and chaired by Syed Junaid Akhlaq of FBISE, concluded with pivotal decisions to revolutionize Pakistan's education system. Key outcomes included endorsing a National Assessment Framework to standardize practices and enhance education quality across boards. The forum revisited the implementation of a new grading system for 2025 exams which was postponed previously, and emphasized organizing summer camps for the top achievers. Sindh's decision to align its exam schedule with other provinces was greatly applauded. These initiatives, focusing on modernizing examination practices and fostering student excellence, represent significant strides in advancing Pakistan's educational landscape. The meeting underscored a collective commitment to improve educational standards, ensuring fair assessment, and providing equal opportunities for students nationwide, marking an advanced transition in the country's academic sector.



Internship Programme

The Inter Boards Coordination Commission (IBCC) Pakistan has successfully launched its 1st merit-based internship program, a crucial milestone in its commitment to nurturing young talent. This initiative has been spearheaded by our dedicated Admin Department upon the directions of the Executive Director, IBCC, Dr. Ghulam Ali Mallah, which aims to provide high-achieving students with indispensable professional experience and skills in the field of IT, Law, Digital marketing, Content Writing, and HR. This program not only benefits the interns but also inculcates fresh perspectives and energy into the organization, fostering innovation and growth. IBCC promotes gender equality and has made a great effort in ensuring that talented young women should also have equal access to these career-building opportunities. Through this internship campaign, IBCC aims to bridge the gap between academia and industry, preparing the next generation of leaders for the challenges and opportunities that lie ahead. Express Attestation Service

In a significant move to enhance applicant convenience, IBCC has implemented express services for document attestation. This new system eliminates the need for long way appointments, allowing applicants to complete their process online and visit the Islamabad office between 6:00 PM to 11:00 PM on their preferred date. This service allows the applicants get their documents attested within 30 minutes. By addressing the concern of limited slot availability in the standard attestation, this initiative offers greater flexibility. The streamlined process reflects IBCC's commitment to delivering efficient, user-centric services that align closely with applicant needs.



Advanced Payment Mechanism

IBCC Pakistan has also initiated a significant upgrade to its banking services in the month of July, 2024. In collaboration with United Bank Limited (UBL), IBCC streamlined its financial operations to provide a more efficient and user-friendly experience to its stakeholders. This transition emphasizes easy online fee payments, making transactions smoother and more accessible for students and institutions alike.

Additionally, the IBCC has introduced an on-site UBL bank booth at IBCC Secretariat, Islamabad. This new facility offers a range of services including ATMs and online payment systems. By bringing these banking amenities directly to the premises, IBCC is enhancing customer convenience by reducing processing

Project Management and Communication

To acquire a more advanced, digitalized and smooth internal communications, IBCC has integrated **"Slack"** (a communication platform) which has significantly improved real-time collaboration among IBCC employees.
